In your answers for each difference try to do at least one of the following:

- explain how you know each difference exists
- give an example of the differences
- explain why that difference exists

- 1) What is the different purpose (what are they for) of a fiction book and a non-fiction book?
- 2) Are they about reality (things that actually happen) or fantasy (things that are made up)?
- 3) Do they have a glossary and / or an index?
- 4) Do they have diagrams and / or pictures with labels and / or captions?
- 5) Do they have numbered lists and / or lists with bullet points?
- 6) Do they have headings and subheadings?
- 7) Do they include technical vocabulary (words about a topic or subject, you might not have the words before or might not understand them)?
