

Stage 2, Page 6, Route A/B - scr and spr

These consonants often appear together before a vowel in words.

Remember: Say the word aloud, then say each letter aloud **as you write it**
e.g. 'scrap, s ... c ... r ... a ... p'



For each line, trace over the first two words and then write two of your own.

A **scrap** of paper is a small bit of paper.

scrap scrap

To **scrub** means to clean very hard.

scrub scrub

To **scram** means to leave quickly.

scram scram

To **sprint** means to run quickly.

sprint sprint

A **spring** is stretchy.

spring spring

Bart **sprang** out from behind the couch to scare Lisa.

sprang sprang

A couch needs to be **sprung** to be nice to sit on.

sprung sprung
