

Stage 4, Page 3, Route A - (or) as 'or' in the middle of words

When the letters 'or' come together they make the sound (or). This sound (or) is usually easy to spell when it comes in the middle of a word as it is just spelt 'or'.

Remember: Say the word aloud, then say each letter aloud **as you write it**
e.g. 'torch, t ... o ... r ... c ... h'
