

## Stage 4, Page 7, Route A/B - wor as (wer)

Normally when the letters or come together they make the sound (or), like in 'for'. However when the letters wor come together the letters or make the sound (er) like in the words below.

Remember: Say the word aloud, then say each letter aloud **as you write it** e.g. 'word, w ... o ... r ... d'



For each line, trace over the first two words and then write two of your own.



Each **word** is made up of letters.

A **worm** lives in soil.

Is it **worth** getting in trouble?

The word were makes the sound (wer) using the letters 'wer' and not 'wor'.  
In the word worn the letters 'wor' make the sound (war), not (wer).  
In the word sword the letter w is silent, so the letters wor make the sound (or).



**Were** you in school on Monday?

were were



Have you **worn** your new shirt?

worn worn



A **sword** needs to be sharp.

## Stage 4, Page 4, Route A/B - (or) as 'ore' at the end of words
