

Stage 8, Page 2, Route A/B - (oi) as oy at the end of words

The sound (oi) is made by the letters oy when it comes at the end of a word or at the end of a syllable like in the words below. Remember a syllable is a beat in a word. In the two-syllable words below you can see where the first syllable ends.

Remember: Say the word aloud, then say each letter aloud **as you write it**
e.g. 'boy, b ... o ... y'



For each line, trace over the first two words and then write two of your own.



Lisa is a girl; Bart is a **boy**.

Joy is being very happy.

Bart always wants a new **toy**.

toy toy

You should be **loyal (loy/al)** to your friends.
